# HELPING YOUR CHILD TO LOVE LEARNING EARLY IN LIFE

Do you know that the love of learning can be developed and cultivated starting at an early age? Here are some strategies:

- 1. Exposed your baby to music. Research indicates there's a significant positive correlation between music education and academic performance. With music, students consistently demonstrating higher scorres in core subjects like math and reading, improved attendance, and increased graduation rates compared to their non-music peers.
- 2. Help children discover interest and passions by exposing them to fun but interesting things. Curiosity is the beginning of learning.
- 3. Provide hands on experiences and activities using different senses to stimulate learning. Exploring with the use of sense of touch, hearing, sight, smell and taste enhances perception of environment and helps connect with the world that surrounds them. It also gives opportunities for children to discover how they learn.
- 4. Repeat experiences that are fun. Children tend to repeat things they enjoy and try to improve the experience and to discover/learn new things.
- 5. Be a model of your own passions. Children tend to copy what they see and imitate their parents values and attitudes towards learning.
- 6. Be observant. Find your child's personality and learning styles. Offer activities that meet the child's temperament and skill level.
- 7. Be supportive and engaging. Intentional interactions emphasizing learning concepts during play and fun activities enhance children's thinking skills.
- 8. Encourage communications. Provide support by asking open-ended questions responding according to child's developmental level.

### **FEDERAL IMPACT AID SURVEY**

Every year, around Fall, local schools send home a survey form for Federal Impact Aid. Do you know why Impact Aid funding is important for your child's school? This funding is provided to school districts to offset the loss of property tax on federal property. The Federal funds provide replacement funding for operating expenses such as materials, equipment, staff, special education programming and building improvements as part of the general funding of the district.

What Can You Do as a Parent and Guardians of Children of Military and DOD civilians?

It's simple: Each year your child receives the Federal Survey Card form that requests confidential information regarding his/her federal connection (including military dependents), thoroughly complete and promptly return this brief survey to the school. That's it! Your participation can contribute to your child's school funding!

#### Remember:

- \*Incomplete cards cannot be submitted for Impact Aid; thereby, creating a loss of funding for the district.
